Thank you for your entry to the Orwell Youth Prize.

Firstly, this is a fantastic piece of writing which demonstrates a sophisticated style of writing. I really love your opening line of "she comes back here" and adds a level of mystique to your story so that the reader continues and wants to find out more! Your use of language is wonderful and I particularly enjoyed reading about your depiction of the environment — winding brambles, a cluster of pearls against her nest and crouching in a field of windflowers really captures the reader's attention. So, well done in displaying a brilliant writing style full of descriptive words.

I love how your story changes across seasons, particularly when "summer rolls through the countryside, and I am crouched in a field of wildflowers". You demonstrate a creative command of the English language which adds depth and variety to your story. Your use of the seasons related very nicely to the theme of 'home' and how the characters/animals in your story have to adapt to their natural environment and their sense of home varying across the page.

In fact, I actually thought that your characters were initially animals/birds because you transported me so wonderfully through your narrative and I felt like I was breathing and living the environment that you had created. I was intrigued by your words "every year, she comes back here" and this really did grip me throughout the story – you certainly know how to keep the reader guessing!

I'm still trying to find out 'who' came home – well done on writing such a wonderful story. You should be commended for your use of language in bringing the story truly alive!
