This Tuesday, it was our 2nd Harry Potter trip to the Studios. And what a wonderful start to December. Hogwarts really was in the Christmas spirit - even more so than two weeks' ago.

Privy to genuine props in close proximity, we were inches from Hagrid's stunt double head used in the motorbike swirly tunnel scene, we looked at original storyboards of deleted scenes and we also saw rejected blue prints for Hagrid's Hut that had taken months to complete. We also learnt about director Alfonso Cuarón's particular demand for trees to be flown from all over the world to Scotland, completing his vision – all illustrating to the children that not everything is perfect – resilience and perseverance is key - some things take lots of time and effort.
